# ANTHROPOLOGIE INSPIRED HAT



## MATERIALS

- 50 g (231 yds) of Knit Picks Palette in Cream, or any preferred fingering/4ply yarn
- I/9 (5.5mm) hook
- Scrap yarn of a different color (to mark the beginning of rounds)
- · Needle to sew in ends
- Scissors

### FINISHED SIZE

19 in. (48 cm) around at the widest part -- the brim. Fits comfortably on a 21-23 in. (or 53-58 cm) head.

## PATTERN NOTES

This hat is inspired by one that was sold by women's clothing chain Anthropologie (for too much money, in my opinion, when you can make a similar one).

\*\*\*This pattern is written in U.S. terms & uses standard abbreviations. \*\*\*

#### SPECIAL STITCHES

**Puff:** [yo, insert hook in st, yo, pull up from st/sp] 2x in the same st/sp, yo, pull through all 5 loops on hook

**V Puff:** make a puff, ch 1, make another puff in the same st

#### HAT

**Setup:** make a magic loop, ch 1 to secure (or if you prefer, make a slip knot, ch 4, ss in 1st ch, ch 1)

**Row 1:** puff 8 into magic loop, do not join -- begin to work in the round (and use your scrap yarn to keep track)

Row 2: V puff in between each puff of row 1

**Row 3:** V puff in ch sp, V puff in sp between Vs of row below, \*skip next ch 1 sp, V puff in each of next sp, ch sp, & sp. Rep from \* 2x. Skip next ch 1 sp, V puff in next sp.

**Row 4:** \*V puff in ch sp, V puff in next sp, skip next ch sp, V puff in next sp, V puff in next ch sp, skip next sp. Rep from \* 3x to end.

**Row 5:** \*V puff in ch sp, V puff in next sp, [skip next ch sp, V puff in next sp] 3x, skip next ch sp. Rep from \* to end.

Row 6: rep row 5 except make the bracket repeat 4x instead of 3x

Rows 7-23: V puff in between each V puff of the row below

\*\*\*At this point, try on your hat and see if it's as long as you'd like it to be before the next section. You may want to add another row or two, but keep in mind this will add to your required yardage.\*\*\*

**Row 24:** \*hdc in ch sp, 2 hdc in sp between v puffs. Rep from \* to end, ending on a hdc in a ch sp **Rows 25-28:** hdc in back of each st of row below (not the two loops you'd usually crochet into, but the similar looking one behind them; this will look funny for the first couple of rows but then it will come together nicely)

\*\*\*Add a couple of extra sts at the end of row 28 if your rows slant so that it lines up with the beginning of row 24. Again try on your hat and make sure it's as long as you'd like before the shell border, and add another row or two if necessary (although again this will add to your required yardage).\*\*\*

Row 29: continuing to work in the back loops of the hdc stitches, sc around

**Row 30:** ss in 1st st, \*hdc 3 in next st, ss in next st. Rep from \* to end, ss in last couple of sts to secure. Tie off & weave in ends.

#### FLOWER

**Setup & Row 1:** Leaving a long tail to sew up your flower and secure it to the hat, ch 77, then dc in 4th st from hook. \*ch1, skip 2 chs, [dc, ch 2, dc] in next ch. Repeat from \* to end, ch 3 (counts as 1st st of next row), turn. There should be 25 dc Vs.

**Row 2:** [dc, ch 2, dc] in 1st ch 2 sp, \*[ch 2, dc 2, ch 2, dc 2] in next 2 ch space, repeat from \* to end (working into the Vs of row 1). Turn.

**Petals:** dc 10 in ch 2 sp, sc in next ch 2 sp. Make 5 more petals this way. For the next 6 petals, dc 8 instead of 10. For the next 5 petals, dc 7. For the next 4, dc 6. For the last 4 petals, dc 5. Tie off and weave in this end.

**Assembly:** roll the flower up with the small petals in the center, and use the long tail to sew it all together securely. Tie off but do not cut the yarn -- use the leftover to sew the flower to the hat directly over the place where the hdc rows visibly begin & end.
